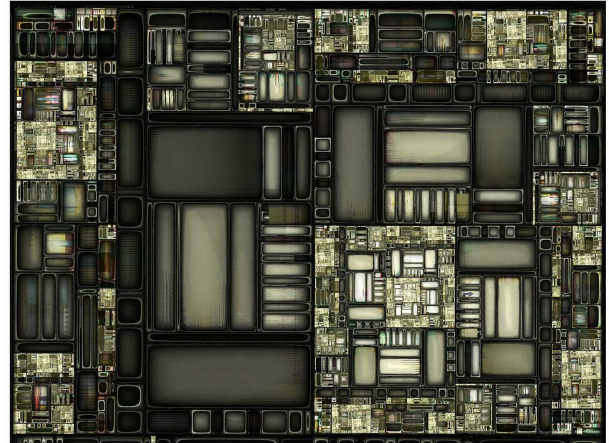
Theories of Media, Materiality and Cultural Techniques
